PROPOSED COVID MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR RESUMPTION WORSHIP AND OTHER ON-SITE ACTIVITIES

Since the outbreak of COVID-19 in early 2020, we have observed the highest safety precautions, including the cessation of in-person worship. The development of effective vaccines, the decrease in the incidence of COVID cases and deaths, and our congregants' compliance with sanctioned medical protocols now warrant our resumption of in-person worship and other activities in our sanctuary. The following protocol will govern our resumption of services until further notice.

1. Our Values

We believe that fellowship among Christians is vital to enhancing our Faith, spreading the gospel, and inspiring us to honor and follow the will of our Lord and Savior. However, we embrace our moral obligation to protect and serve each other. In our Statement of Faith, we acknowledge that God "calls us into his church to accept the cost and joy of discipleship, to be his servants in the service of men."

2. Entry

Enter the church through one or two doors: the double doors on the North side / High Street, or the single door on the West side, from the parking lot.

3. Contact Tracing*

When you enter the church, ushers will distribute a card for you to indicate your name, telephone number, email address, and seat location. Return the card to an usher after the service has concluded and before you leave the sanctuary. The purpose of the cards is to permit FCCC to conduct efficient contact tracing in the unfortunate event that a congregant develops COVID symptoms. The further purpose is to prevent contacts with persons who were not seated near the person(s) who ultimately show symptoms.

4. Masks

Cover your face with a mask before you leave your car (or if walking, before you enter the church). Keep the mask in place until you return to your car. If you do not have a mask, masks and hand sanitizer will be available at the entrances.

5. Temperature Checks

Submit to a temperature check at each entrance. If you do not feel well or have a fever, please remain at home.

6. Offering and Communion

Please drop your offering (envelopes and cash) in designated containers at the entry doors to avoid close contact with ushers and passing collection plates from person to person. Envelopes will be available at the entrances. On first Sundays, please collect your pre-wrapped packets for observance of Eucharist at the door upon entering the sanctuary - for the same purposes.

7. Seating

Go directly to your seat immediately upon entering. You may seat yourself in designated, open seating. Open seating is pre-designated on every other row to assure social distancing. Couples or families wishing to sit together may do so, even in non-designated areas, but groups should assure that they are seated at an appropriate distance from other worshipers (at least six feet on the same pew).

8. Fellowship

Avoid hugging, embracing, and otherwise touching other congregants before, during and after worship and other services. All fellowship during the worship service is discontinued until further notice. Unless you are participating in the service or need to use the facilities, do not leave your seat during the service.

9. Benediction

Ushers will dismiss congregants by sections and rows to the nearest exit to safeguard social distancing.

*Depending on the attendance for the first three Sundays, it's possible a few adjustments will be made.
