Pastor Courtney D. Meadows is an emerging twenty-first-century leader, gifted gospel preacher, empowerment speaker, and "flame igniter." Although anointed by God while in his mother's womb, Pastor Meadows affirmed his call to ministry at age six and has since devoted his life to empowering humanity. He is widely known as an "Old Soul" for his powerful presentation of wisdom and hope, appealing to the young and old. The grace of God upon Pastor Meadows's life has allowed him to travel throughout the United States and Africa.

With over a decade of pastoral experience, he previously served as Senior Pastor of the First Missionary Baptist Church of Whitehall, Alabama, and the historic Hutchinson Missionary Baptist Church of Montgomery, Alabama. Pastor Meadows uses those experiences to foster intentional intergenerational ministry at the Grace Baptist Church of Atlanta, Georgia, as the Generational Pastor and preaching/teaching partner to Senior Pastor Rev. Clinton McFarland. He is the Founder and Chief Igniting Officer of Igniting the Flame Ministries, a ministry established to encourage, equip, and empower believers to creatively reach the least, last, and lost with their talents, testimonies, and technology.

Pastor Meadows believes in ministry "beyond the four walls" and has championed civic engagement, community development, and youth empowerment. He has served in critical leadership roles with the Southern Youth Leadership Development Institute and Hope Inspired Ministries of Montgomery, Alabama. Additionally, Pastor Meadows served as Chaplain and Faith Coach to the Alabama State University Football team and coaching staff. He is a member of the Board of Directors for Leadership Montgomery and is a graduate of its Torchbearers Class XI.

A servant of all mankind, he is a proud member of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated. He has received honors and awards of distinction for his work in leadership development, nonprofit administration, community outreach, and progressive ministry.

He is a graduate of Talladega College and is pursuing a Master of Divinity degree at the prestigious Candler School of Theology at Emory University of Atlanta, Georgia. Most of all, he is the proud husband of Roneshia Meadows and dog-dad to "bishop."

2023 Daving To Make A Difference Honoree

The Honorable Mayor Steven L. Reed

In November 2019, Steven L. Reed made history by receiving more than 67 percent of the popular vote to become the first Black Mayor of Montgomery in the city's 200-year history. This marked another turning point for Alabama's Capital City, which is known globally as The Birthplace of the Civil Rights Movement.

As a native of Montgomery and product of its public schools, Mayor Reed is committed to realizing his vision of a more equitable, innovative and compassionate city. To that end, he is advancing an agenda that puts Montgomery on track to become a leader in the New South.

Now entering his second term in office following a decisive victory during his reelection campaign on August 22, 2023, Mayor Reed continues cultivating a climate where entrepreneurs can not only survive – but thrive. In the past two years, Mayor Reed and partners attracted more than one billion dollars in new capital investment and announced over 2,000 new jobs. During his tenure, Mayor Reed successfully led a transformational ballot initiative to increase investment in Montgomery's school system for the first time in over 40 years. Amid the height of the COVID-19 pandemic and its effects on the public and private sectors, Mayor Reed restructured city government to increase efficiency and effectiveness, increased municipal reserves to record levels and avoided employee furloughs and layoffs – all while maintaining a balanced budget and paying off millions of dollars in debt. As a result, bond agencies awarded Montgomery its best credit ratings since the Great Recession. In the aftermath of George Floyd's murder Mayor Reed steered the city through peaceful protests while strengthening relations between police officers and the communities they serve.

Mayor Reed is a lifelong public servant and leader who previously served as Montgomery County, Alabama's first Black and youngest elected Probate Judge. During his tenure as Montgomery's Chief Election Official, he implemented progressive solutions that ranged from ensuring election integrity and expanding mental health services to increasing voter access and being the first probate judge in the state to issue same-sex marriage licenses. For his work, Mayor Reed was selected as a member of the Department of Homeland Security's Election Integrity Commission.

Mayor Reed is a recipient of the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Leadership Award for Governmental Service and is a member of the New Deal Leaders network, the Bloomberg Harvard City Leadership Initiative and the UNUM Fellows cohort. He was selected for the Aspen Institute Socrates Program, is a member of the National League of Cities Public Safety Committee and is the First Vice President for the African American Mayors Association. He is also. As an active member of US Conference of Mayors, he was elected to serve as a Trustee and sits on the Transportation Committee and the Tourism, Arts, Parks, Entertainment and Sports Committee. Additionally, Mayor Reed is a member of USCM's Center for Compassionate and Equitable Cities Task Force, Mayors Water Council Task Force and the Hunger and Homelessness Task Force.

Beyond his civic engagements, Mayor Reed is an accomplished author, with his highly anticipated book "FIRST, BEST: Lessons in Leadership and Legacy from Today's Civil Rights Movement" released last month. The book is a powerful memoir that reflects on his story of forging a new path and carrying on his legacy as the son of a civil rights leader.

Mayor Reed graduated from Morehouse College cum laude and has a Master of Business Administration from Vanderbilt University's Owen Graduate School of Management. He and his wife Tamika are the proud parents of three children.

Central Alabama CrimeStoppers

Central Alabama CrimeStoppers is a nonprofit organization that brings together law enforcement, media, and the community to **stop**, **solve**, **and prevent crime**.

Central Alabama CrimeStoppers has stayed on a path of success since its inception in 1997. Beginning with a simple mission to place Montgomery area fugitives behind bars and help identify suspects involved in unsolved felony investigations, to now reach 32 counties and is partnered with 91 law enforcement agencies across the state of Alabama. This steady growth has allowed CrimeStoppers to partner with more law enforcement agencies while engaging and reaching many more residents, helping solve felony cases, and placing more wanted criminals behind bars.

2023 has been an exceptional year for Central Alabama CrimeStoppers, from being nominated and receiving the 2022 Southeastern CrimeStoppers Association Productivity Award and receiving a proclamation from Montgomery Mayor, Steven Reed, declaring June 6, as Central Alabama CrimeStoppers Day.

CrimeStoppers depends on its many partners from the media to law enforcement to help get the word out about wanted fugitives and unsolved criminal investigations. Most importantly the public's quick response to our press releases results in a number of tips that help law enforcement find fugitives and solve cases. This year alone, CrimeStoppers reached over twelve million social media followers on over 1,000 posts, CrimeStoppers has received over 1,000 anonymous tips, cleared over 300 cases, paid a cash reward of \$39,870.00 on 50 solved cases, assisted with 160 fugitive apprehensions, and over 550 criminal charges, recovered 192 firearms, assisted with solving 20 homicide investigations and helped locate 44 missing people.
