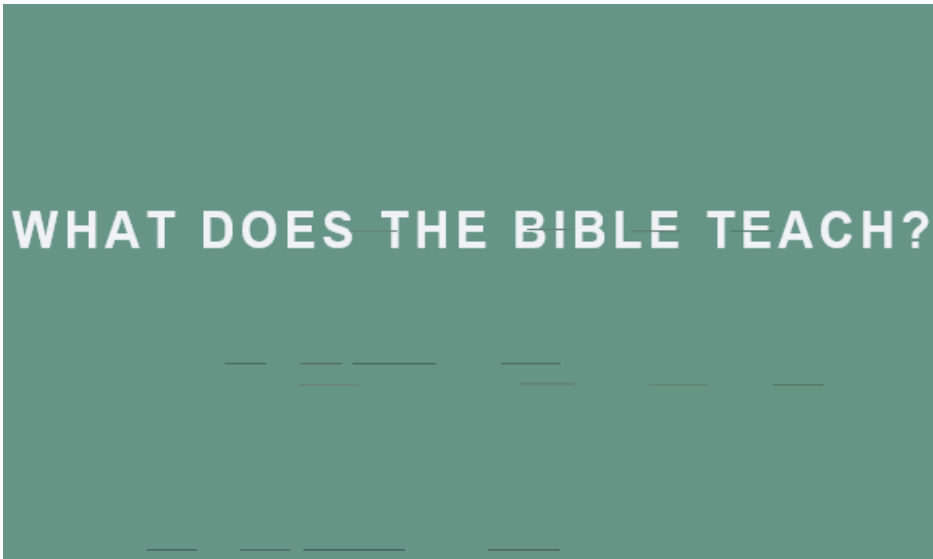

Bible Verses About Generous Giving
